³While he was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately and said, "Tell us, when will these things happen? And what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the world?"

⁴Jesus answered them, "Watch out that no one deceives you. ⁵Because many will come in my name, saying, 'I am the Christ,' and they will deceive many people. 6You will hear of wars and rumors of wars. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. 8But all these things are only the beginning of birth pains. Then they will hand you over to be persecuted, and they will put you to death. ¹⁶They will never be hungry or thirsty ever again.


The sun will never beat upon them, nor will any scorching heat,

He will lead them to springs of living water.




